PUBLIC FORUM:

Nathan Thompson the Executive Director of NSLC Habitat for Humanity spoke briefly regarding their program and the partnerships NSLC Habitat for Humanity has with the Hibbing Highschool, the College and the City. Mr. Thompson explained that NSLC Habitat for Humanity has built 34 homes in Hibbing, and 16 homes in partnership with the Hibbing Highschool. Mr. Thompson stated that NSLC Habitat for Humanity has plans to start two home projects in the City of Hibbing in 2023. Mr. Thompson wished to acknowledge that Community Development Director Betsy Olivanti has been helpful in acquiring land to build homes on. Mr. Thompson stated that NSLC Habitat for Humanity has Board Members, volunteers and donors from the Hibbing community.

Community Development Director Betsy Olivanti explained that the bonds were paid off and satisfied in 2020, however the account stayed open and has been reconciled every month. Community Development Director Olivanti stated that this will transfer the facility into the purview of the City Council.

Community Development Director Olivanti explained that MnDOT is working with the IRR and other partners to secure funding from available sources to focus on EV charging infrastructure in northeastern MN; This letter of support is the first step in the City of Hibbing indicating interest in moving forward with a project if funding is secured.

Internal Auditor Husmann explained that they continue to face mechanical issues on all of the existing transit busses; the busses that are on order are expected anywhere from July

23 to the end of the first quarter of 2024. Internal Auditor Husmann stated that this is an E450 which is a bit smaller than our current busses; it is in pretty good shape with approximately 50,000 miles. Internal Auditor Husmann stated that since Covid, the City has built up a reserve account by being able to keep all revenue for the past couple years; the reserve account will pay for this bus purchase.

Councilor Bayliss, supported by Councilor Whitney, moved to approve the purchase of a 2017 used transit bus from Hoglund Bus Company in an amount not to exceed \$52,500 plus tax, title, and license fees.

Discussion: Mayor Hyde asked with this being a smaller bus, is it the same size busses the City will be getting; Internal Auditor Husmann stated yes. Mayor Hyde stated that this will be a nice transition into the busses we will be getting.
