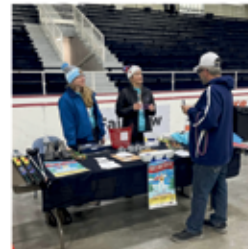

Hull Rust Mine View

Location: 611 McKinley Street

The "Grand Canyon of the North," the World's Largest Open Pit Iron Ore Mine is located on the north edge of Hibbing. It is a landscape that has been more than 120 years in the making. Visitors can watch mining in action as they gaze out over a pit that stretches 3.5 miles long, 1.5 miles wide and reaches a depth of 535 feet! This pit now encompasses more than 50 individual mines, over 40 separate properties, and since 1895 more than 800 million tons of iron ore have been removed.
